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G.A.A. Player's Injury Scheme Procedure for Claims

- It is the responsibility of the Team Manager/Selector to make sure that the referee has details of the injured player after a match.
- The Player's Welfare Officer must also be notified with relevant details of an injury as soon as possible (no more than 2/3 days after injury).
- The Player's Welfare Officer will send a Preliminary Notification Form to the GAA Insurance company, Willis, within 60 days of the injury occurring.
- Please note that there is an excess of €100.00 on each claim. Loss of wages claims are subject to an excess of one week.
- The maximum limit per claim for Physiotherapy/Sports Massage is €200.00 per claim unless physio treatment is needed for post operative rehab. The maximum limit per claim €4,500.
- All consultant, physio, MRI scans and other medical **receipts** (not invoices) relating to the injury must be provided and passed to the Player's Welfare Officer who will in turn forward them onto Willis. While the claim form must be submitted within 60 days of the injury, applicable receipts can be submitted after this time.
- It is the responsibility of the claimant to ensure that all relevant sections of the form are filled out correctly and all receipts are attached before passing the form on to the Player Welfare Officer. It is essential that section E is filled out correctly and signed and stamped by the doctor/dentist.
