### **History of the GAA**

In this our 125<sup>th</sup> year it is important to reflect on the history of our Association, where we have come from, who has been a part of it, and how the Association has grown to be one of the most successful sporting associations in the world.

In recognising this, the GAA has commissioned the GAA Oral History Project which aims to record the rich, diverse and complex history of the Association through the words of people in every parish of the country and amongst Irish people overseas. As part of this project the GAA has commissioned a book “**The GAA, A People’s History**” which will be officially launched at four locations around the country over the next seven weeks to mark our 125 Celebrations. The book will be available nationwide in the coming weeks and will retail at €29.99. It is a social history of the Association containing many rare, high quality photographs and images and is sure to be a keenly sought after publication. The book illustrates the story of how the GAA has carved for itself a unique place at the heart of Irish life and how Gaelic Games and the social world which revolves around the Association, has shaped the lives of generations of Irish people.

## Club Focus

Seán O'Heslins, Ballinamore, Leitrim / CLG Seán Uí Eislin, Béal an Átha Móir, Liatroim.

2009 will be fondly remembered by clubs around the country for a variety of reasons, including the Association's 125 Celebrations but for Seán O'Heslins it will go down as the year when they completed and unveiled an impressive redevelopment of their facilities.

Five years work at a cost of €1.8m, has seen the Ballinamore club's home ground morph into a state of the art facility to aid them in their work. A complete resurface and re-draining job on their main pitch and the acquisition of land, which allowed them to develop a second pitch for training, was complemented by the construction of a stand facility and dressingroom pavilion with provision for four teams in addition to a gym and meeting room.

While the idea of installing lights on the training field may arise, attracting high profile fixtures such as county league games or this year's county intermediate football final will help shine a light on the excellent revamp overseen by the club.

## Swine Flu

The rapid spread of Swine Flu continues to be a prime concern of the GAA, and given the role the Association plays in the Irish social scene, it is vital that all members and volunteers take adequate steps to contain the spread of the virus among local clubs and communities.

There are some simple steps everyone can take to stop the spread of Swine Flu:

- Use a tissue to catch coughs or sneezes
- Bin the tissue straightaway
- Wash your hands well and often.

Following these steps will help stop the flu and all respiratory illness from spreading to others.

If you or anyone in your club feels they have the flu:

- Check the symptoms on the HSE website at [www.hse.ie](http://www.hse.ie) or by calling the 24-hour Flu Information Line on 1800 941100.
- Contact your GP by telephone - **don't** go the surgery or to A&E, as this places other people at risk of infection.
- Your GP will decide if you need testing or treatment.

The vast majority of people who get this flu are able to recover at home without needing anti-viral treatment - following simple home-care advice is sufficient for the majority of cases.

Informative posters detailing simple precautions are available from the HSE and it is recommended that clubs display such posters anywhere large groups are likely to assemble on your club's grounds.
